Grace, mercy and peace be with you in the name of our Living Savior, Jesus the Christ.

As Pastor Dave, Frank Jackson and I set out for Haiti last month, I wrote four things in a journal that I hoped would happen on our trip.

1. I hoped that our eyes, ears, hearts and spirit would be open to experiencing Haiti without judgment, expectation, or investment in any particular outcome.
2. I hoped that God would guide us and be present with us in our discernment about mission.
3. I hoped that we would build relationships that were meaningful and lasting.
4. I hoped that we might glimpse the future.

I am thankful to say that each of those hopes was realized during our time in Haiti.

For five days we listened to people's stories. We saw signs of destruction and new life. We bore witness to the grief and hope that are tangible among the Haitian people. We were inspired by Lutheran brothers and sisters who are proclaiming the Gospel to communities thirsting for a word of grace. We were called into relationship with Eglise Luthérienne d'Haiti, a partner church body of the ELCA that has been in existence for approximately one year. For five days, we saw Christ in and among the people of Haiti.

Our trip to Haiti was blessed in many ways. We were blessed by you, the people of Holy Trinity, who sent us to explore the ways that God is calling us into mission in Haiti. We were blessed by the people of Haiti who taught us about faith and hope, even in the most difficult situations. We were blessed by our partners in the Lutheran church in Haiti (ELH) who told us that they no longer talk about rubble, but Resurrection. We were blessed by God's invitation to be co-workers in God's Resurrecting work in Haiti and in our own lives. We were truly blessed.

Our experiences last month and our vision for future mission in Haiti are too extensive to share in one newsletter article, but there will be many opportunities for conversation, discernment and action. If Haiti is a cause that moves your heart, if you are curious about what God may be doing in the world through Holy Trinity, if you would like to experience the joys and challenges of building the Church, I invite you to participate in this new mission opportunity. Jesus said it best, "Come and see".

3. Use your card at the check out to pay for your groceries, gas, or prescriptions. Your card balance will be shown on your receipt.
4. Refill your card as many times as you like.

Every time a card is refilled our youth group will receive 5% of that purchase. The cards may also be used at King Soopers gas stations.

SOMETHING NEW FOR BEV'S BAG BRIGADE ----

Recently Urban Peak Shelter for Teenagers indicated that they had "enough sleeping mats for now". You will never know how deflated a dozen or so ladies were with this news. Were we going to have to disband? Should we discontinue accepting bags? What about the bags we still have to complete? **WE ARE NOT QUITTING! WE JUST HAVE TO FIND A NEW OUTLET!** Several ladies started calling around.

Alice Fisicaro and I loaded the trunk of her car with 12 mats and headed for town. Our first stop was at a Catholic charity who had no need for them. With drooped shoulders and dragging feet we headed for Volunteers of America. We took one mat in and gave the lady at the front desk our story. She called her manager who said "we'll take them." I said can you use 50-70 mats per year? She said "all you can provide". Our chests puffed up, two fellows helped carry in the 12 mats and before we left the building all the mats were gone - among them a mother with two small children who took two for the kiddies, a lady who said she'd sleep on the ground if that was the only way she could get one. There were others who indeed do sleep on the ground and commented on how warm they would be. They weren't just handed out, but signed out to each one that took a mat.

Before we left they even took our picture - on such a windy day that must be a sight. They are going to put it in their newsletter.

We're back in business and Volunteers of America is our new "home for the mats".

The emergency call by Lutheran Family Services for blankets was met with a tremendous response which has allowed us to supply our refugee families with many extra blankets and stock pile some for future arrivals. However, we are still taking blankets if you have some to share.

Also we now have a fully-stocked work bench and many tool boxes full of everything we will need to fix up any furniture that needs it.
