Congratulations to Pastor Emily Cardin for being the recipient of next year's "Outstanding Contribution to Specialized Ministry" award presented annually by the Iliff School of Theology. This award will be presented to Pastor Emily at Iliff's Annual Alumni & Friends Award Banquet held in the Iliff Great Hall on February 9, 2012.

Reverend Emily Cardin comes to us from the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America, Rocky Mountain Synod, and her local church, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. Chaplain Cardin's first prison experience was as a volunteer with the *Making Choices* Program in 2003 and 2004 at DWCF. Part of her call to prison ministry, which began in September of 2004, was to continue the work done by her predecessors in ministry to the offender population of Denver Women's Correctional Facility and to continue the momentum of the *New Beginnings Church*. Chaplain Cardin brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to DWCF beyond her formal theological training at Iliff School of Theology. She received her Masters of Divinity Certificate of Theological Study from the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago. She was a nurse/BSN for 24 years, and most of her work was with women's health, trauma, and addiction. She devotes a minimum of 18 hours a week as an Associate Chaplain inside DWCF. Additional time is spent in the community, taking the pulpit on Sundays for raising awareness and support for *New Beginnings*, both prayerful and financial.

New Beginnings Church is an integral part of Chaplain Cardin's ministry. The church worship service averages between 50 and 70 offenders per week, and this past Christmas service was attended by 250 offenders. *New Beginnings Church* is affiliated with Prison Congregations of America and Jubilee Ministries, and arm of the Peace and Justice Network of the Episcopal Church of the United States. Congratulations, Emily, on an award well deserved.

Hugh Patterson's Reflections on the December 16 Visit to Prison

Out in an isolated part of the city, there's a large concrete type building looking hard and cold and uninteresting. But things change as you walk inside the building.

First of all, a very pretty lady comes to greet you. She gives a brief tour of the place. Of all things, there are apartments for ladies and their children. This is an institution for ladies who have had misfortune in their past behavior. They don't look like they belong there. Given a chance, they have a big smile on their face. You want to ask them, why in the world are you here? It kind of puts a lump in your throat to think of their lives.

After the tour last Friday, our group went back into the meeting room. Chairs were set up for worship service. I was invited to go shake hands with the ladies as they entered. I guess it shows that I am a natural hand-shaker. As they came, I tried to catch their eye. If they looked like they were interested, I reached out for them. But actually, even if I just lifted my hand a tiny bit, they would stop and shake my hand.

As they sat down, I guessed that there were about a 100 ladies there. When the service started, I noticed that Pastor Emily has complete confidence in these inmates. They all chatted with each other like they were old friends. I learned that they live together with roommates. This makes sense because they seemed to know each other very well.

We started with singing. Oh how they can sing. We all sang together. Then they were invited to speak their minds. They shared what is going on in their lives now. Some went to the front and read about what's going on in their lives.

There was one woman who remained seated, but she was the comedian in the group. She told her story in such a funny way that everyone laughed. Me too-- even though I couldn't really hear all that she was saying.

I was really amazed by Pastor Emily. Everyone's attention is always on her. She is so conversational; everyone feels so comfortable. No one is afraid to speak up. Pastor Emily has a great sense of humor, even while she's giving a sermon. People laughed during the sermon. I liked that.

I was impressed by the complete order of everything. Pastor Emily is both capable of holding everything together and also making everyone feel at ease. She is an amazing lady.

I would recommend that anyone who has not had this experience, if you have a soft heart and are filled with inner feelings, please think of making a visit. It was a great temptation for me to hug them each. But I held back. I still keep seeing them in my mind waving to me as they left to go back to their units. They have four walls. I have my freedom.
