PRISON VISIT

Even though I know we should visit people in prisons, when Jan Harvey asked if I wanted to visit New Beginnings congregation at the Denver Women's Correctional Facility, I was reluctant and kept putting it off. I was afraid it would be too emotional. I was worried that the women would feel I was there just out of curiosity.

Luckily Jan is very persistent, and on Friday, June 17, I went with Bill, Jack Armstrong, Illa Toney, and Jan Mason and her mother.

The experience WAS very emotional; it was also very moving and inspirational and enlightening. And very humbling.

Pastor Emily told us 85 % of the women have drug or alcohol addiction problems. I think most were probably there because of a combination of bad parenting, bad genes, bad blood chemistry, and bad choices. I found myself thinking how lucky I was to have been born to a loving, strong family.

The women sang hymns with gusto; they also wept and prayed from the heart. Three of the inmates were baptized at the service, which caused rejoicing. But there was no doubt this was not an ordinary congregation. The nervous tension in the room was palpable. Blue-uniformed guards paced around, looking for any infraction of the rules. No talking; no slouching; stay with your group.

When it was time to leave, the guards made them file out, even though the service had gone a little long and was not over.

Before the service had started, Pastor Emily asked one of the inmates to show us around and tell us about the prison. Sally was very personable and intelligent, but her addiction problem had brought her to prison seven times. Sally had a problem following rules. When Pastor Emily noticed her tennis shoes, she sent her back to her cell to change into the mandatory black boots the inmates are required to wear.

After the service was over, we chatted with Pastor Emily. I asked what they needed. She said they need funds, of course, so they can purchase more study Bibles. They also need greeting cards and Christmas cards for the women to send out and yarn for their knitting.

Visiting the prison opened my eyes to a group of people that we as a society have locked away far from sight.

I have added Sally and Regina and Jennifer and Felicia and Janice and the other inmates of the DWCF to my prayer list.
