Sisters and Brothers in Christ, grace, mercy and peace be with you in the name of our Risen Savior Jesus the Christ.

More than a year ago, members of the youth committee articulated the specific goal of creating a cohesive senior high ministry. Through prayer, discernment, and careful planning the youth committee began moving towards that goal by introducing a senior high faith formation class, hosting youth events and helping our youth with fundraising efforts. In August, fourteen senior high youth participated in a mission trip to Galveston, TX, where they helped rebuild a home damaged by a hurricane. During the course of their week in the Gulf Coast our youth grew closer to God and each other as they lived out our Church's mission statement, "God's Work. Our Hands." Thanks to the hard work of the youth committee, the trust and participation of our youth and their parents, and your generous support we have the beginning of a cohesive senior high youth ministry program.

My prayer is that our youth will continue to grow closer to each other, that they will fall deeper in love with the God who claimed them at their baptism, and that they will find they have the hearts of a servant. It will take all of us at Holy Trinity to see this work through.

To our youth, I ask that you keep showing up and participating in the life of this congregation. To our parents, I ask that you encourage your child's participation and model it in your own life. To our congregation, I ask that you continue to support our youth through the use of King Soopers gift cards, by contributions to their fundraising efforts, by your prayers and through your good will.

Our senior high youth have two great opportunities this year to participate in gatherings of the greater Church. The Rocky Mountain Synod Youth Gathering will be held November 18-20 in Estes Park, Colorado. The ELCA's National Youth Gathering will be held July 18-22, 2012 in New Orleans. These gatherings will be at the same time costly and priceless. Expenses for the two events will be approximately \$150 and \$1300 per youth. Yet each gathering also offers the opportunities for our youth to bond with each other, grow in faith, and practice lives of discipleship. I consider the expense an investment in the lives of our young people.

I would like to offer my deepest thanks to the youth committee for their commitment to our young people and to our congregation for supporting our youth in the year ahead. My closing words are directed to our youth and were written first by the Apostle Paul to his young friend Timothy, "Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity." And keep showing up.

ADOPT A STUDENT

The Mission Committee will again be sponsoring the ADOPT A STUDENT program for the kids in our Sister Parish of El Tronador in El Salvador.

Starting in September and ending in December 2011 we are asking for donations to keep the kids in school. The families are all very poor as it is a small farming community, and very few if any of the fathers do anything except tend their own small plots. If we can send the kids to school and see that they learn to read and write, we can perhaps break the chain of poverty and help the families to do more than just survive.

The Adopt A Student program was started in 1998. The children's families have to pay for children to go to school - tuition, uniforms, books and supplies. All money sent to them is carefully given; then the students are watched to see that they go to school and progress from grade to grade. For children above the 4th grade to attend, the cost is approximately \$200. If we did not send this scholarship money, they would not be able to attend school at all.

We know that money is scarce, but please prayerfully consider helping these kids who appreciate and respect the help we give them. They send us letters and cards and we do get reports on their progress. Any amount that you can give will be most appreciated. Envelopes will be available in the pew racks for donations from September to December..

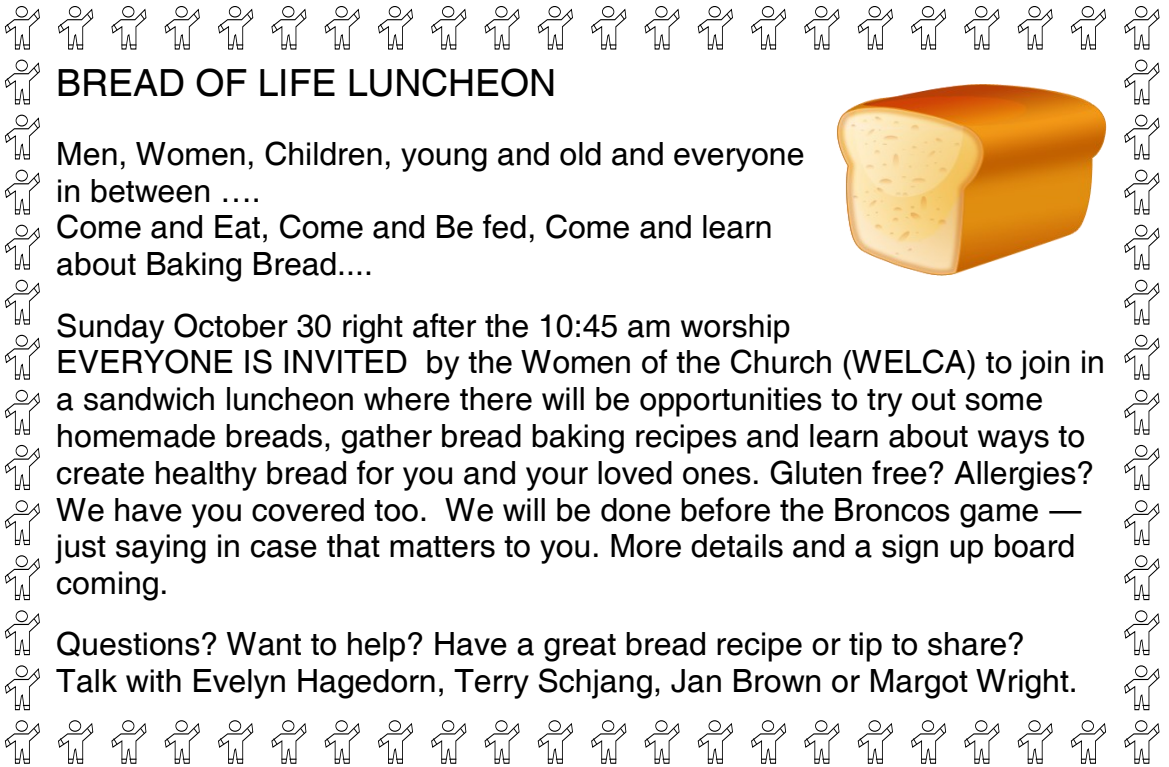

Sunday October 30 right after the 10:45 am worship

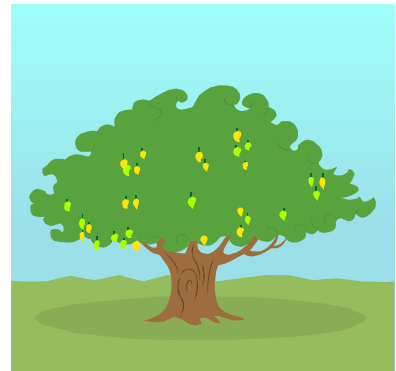


